Effective 1 January 2023



How does a substance / method make it to the Prohibited List?



Any substance & method that satisfies any two of the following three criteria:



Potential to enhance sport performance



Represents an actual / potential health risk



Violates the spirit of sport

Substances / methods which mask the effect or detection of prohibited substances / prohibited methods will also be added too!



Some Major Modifications on the 2023 Prohibited List:

S9. Glucocorticoids

Otic administration is not prohibited

M1. Manipulation of **Blood and Blood Components**

Prohibited at All Times: Voxelotor was added as an example

P1. Beta-Blockers

Prohibited In-Competition: Mini-Golf

Prohibited at All Times:

Underwater Sports in all subdisciplines of Freediving, Spearfishing & Target Shooting

Important update in 2024!

S7. Narcotics - Tramadol will be prohibited in-competition from 1 January 2024

Why Tramadol?

- Tramadol abuse represents actual or potential health risk
- Potential to enhance sport performance

Why 2024?

The delay allows sufficient time for :

- Communicating this change to the anti-doping community
- The medical practitioners to address the safe use of Tramadol for clinical purposes within anti-doping
